

United States Enclaves and Exclaves

New York New York City - Manhattan - 40°41.4′N 74°2.7′W;

The size of the original portion of Ellis Island and its environs is 4.68 acres (0.0189 km²) of the overall area of 27.5 acres. From a 1998 U.S. Supreme Court decision it follows that a seawall that was completed in 1914 made the original Ellis Island a true enclave within New Jersey.

Each enclave listed in this section has a legal status equivalent to the one other entity that entirely surrounds it. None of the enclaves has a separate main region of which it is a part. Some enclaves are sovereign states, completely surrounded by another one, and therefore not exclaves.

Enclave

The word enclave is French and first appeared in the mid-15th century as a derivative of the verb enclaver (1283), from the colloquial Latin inclavare (to close with a key). Originally, it was a term of property law that denoted the situation of a land or parcel of land surrounded by land owned by a different owner, and that could not be reached for its exploitation in a practical and sufficient manner without crossing the surrounding land.

In law, this created a *servitude* of passage for the benefit of the owner of the surrounded land. The first diplomatic document to contain the word *enclave* was the <u>Treaty of Madrid</u>, signed in 1526.

Later, the term enclave began to be used also to refer to parcels of countries, counties, fiefs, communes, towns, parishes, etc. that were surrounded by alien territory. This French word eventually entered English and other languages to denote the same concept, although local terms have continued to be used. In India, the word "pocket" is often used as a synonym for enclave (such as "the pockets of Puducherry district"). In British administrative history, subnational enclaves were usually called **detachments** or **detached parts**, and national enclaves as **detached districts** or **detached dominions**. In English <u>ecclesiastic</u> history, subnational enclaves were known as **peculiars** (see also <u>royal peculiar</u>).

The word exclave is a logically extended back-formation of enclave.

An Enclave

An **enclave** is a <u>territory</u> (or a small territory as part of a larger one) that is entirely surrounded by the territory of one other <u>state</u> or <u>entity</u>. Enclaves may also exist within <u>territorial waters</u>. *Enclave* is sometimes used improperly to denote a territory that is only partly surrounded by another state. <u>Vatican City</u> and <u>San Marino</u>, both enclaved by <u>Italy</u>, and <u>Lesotho</u>, enclaved by <u>South Africa</u>, are completely enclaved <u>sovereign states</u>.

An Exclave



An **exclave** is a portion of a state or district geographically separated from the main part by surrounding alien territory of one or more states or districts etc.. Many exclaves are also enclaves, but not all: an exclave can be surrounded by the territory of more than one state. The <u>Azerbaijani</u> exclave of <u>Nakhchivan</u> is an example of an exclave that is not an enclave, as it borders <u>Armenia</u>, <u>Turkey</u> and <u>Iran</u>.

Semi-enclaves and semi-exclaves

Semi-enclaves and semi-exclaves are areas that, except for possessing an unsurrounded sea border, i.e., a coastline contiguous with <u>international waters</u>, would otherwise be enclaves or exclaves. Enclaves and semi-enclaves can exist as independent states, e.g., <u>Monaco</u>, <u>The Gambia</u> and <u>Brunei</u> are semi-enclaves), while exclaves and semi-exclaves proper always constitute just a part of a sovereign state (like the Kaliningrad Oblast).

A pene-exclave

A **pene-exclave** is a part of the territory of one country that can be conveniently approached—in particular, by wheeled traffic—only through the territory of another country. Pene-exclaves are also called functional exclaves or practical exclaves. Many pene-exclaves partially border their own territorial waters (i.e., they are not surrounded by other nations' territorial waters), such as <u>Point Roberts</u>, <u>Washington</u> and Minnesota's <u>Northwest Angle</u>. A pene-exclave can also exist entirely on land, such as when intervening mountains render a territory inaccessible from other parts of a country except through alien territory. A commonly cited example is the <u>Kleinwalsertal</u>, a valley part of <u>Vorarlberg</u>, Austria, that is accessible only from Germany to the north.

In the United States of America:

- o In <u>Alaska</u>, the community of <u>Klukwan</u> is surrounded by <u>Haines Borough</u>, even though the community is part of the <u>Hoonah-Angoon Census Area</u>, which is in turn part of the <u>Unorganized Borough</u>.
- o In California
 - <u>San Jose</u> has eight exclaves surrounded by unincorporated <u>Santa</u> <u>Clara County</u>, one of which is connected at a quadripoint.
 - <u>Vacaville</u> has a two exclaves, both surrounded by unincorporated <u>Solano County</u>. One is separated from the main city limits by the unincorporated village of <u>Elmira</u>.
 - Adelanto has three exclaves, surrounded by incorporated Victorville.
 - <u>San Bernardino</u> has two exclaves, surrounded by unincorporated San Bernardino County.
 - Loma Linda has three exclaves, surrounded by the city of San Bernardino
 - Redlands has four exclaves. One surrounded by the city of San Bernardino, and three surrounded by unincorporated San Bernardino county



- In Colorado, Arapahoe County has seven exclaves within the City and County of Denver, including the city of Glendale and the unincorporated neighborhood of Holly Hills. In turn, Denver has a counter-exclave surrounded by Glendale. Jefferson County also has five exclaves, three of which are surrounded by Denver. Additionally, Boulder and Weld counties both have an exclave within the City and County of Broomfield, and Broomfield has an exclave in Boulder County.
- o In <u>Georgia</u>, <u>Bibb County</u> has an exclave within <u>Monroe County</u>. This boundary is disputed, however. [64][65]
- In <u>Kentucky</u>, following the merger of the <u>Louisville</u> and <u>Jefferson</u>
 <u>County</u> governments in 2003, the new Louisville Metro has several disjoint parcels of land throughout the county, of which some are enclaves in other cities.
- o In Minnesota, Mendota Heights has an exclave that is surrounded by Lilydale.
- o In <u>New Jersey</u>, <u>Middletown Township</u> in <u>Monmouth County</u> has an exclave surrounded by the borough of <u>Keansburg</u>. [66]
- o In Ohio:
 - In Montgomery County, there are several cities with enclaves and exclaves. <u>Dayton</u> has one exclave, consisting of <u>Dayton</u>

 <u>International Airport</u>. Dayton also surrounds several enclaves that belong to the cities of <u>Trotwood</u> and <u>Riverside</u>. Riverside also has several exclaves that border more than one city as well as additional parcels that are connected to the city only by a roadway. <u>Clayton</u> contains several enclaves surrounded by <u>Englewood</u> and one that is completely surrounded by <u>Union</u>. Other than Dayton's exclave, these enclaves and exclaves were formed by municipality-township mergers in the 1990s.
 - In Summit County:
 - The city of <u>Cuyahoga Falls</u> has four small enclave/exclaves along its border with the city of <u>Akron</u>. Several houses along Smith Road are legally in the Falls, while neighbors and municipal lands on all sides of the properties are legally within Akron.
 - <u>Bath Township</u> has four exclaves, of which one is an enclave of Akron.
 - <u>Springfield Township</u> has six exclaves, of which two are enclaves in Akron.
 - Coventry Township has six exclaves, of which five are enclaves in Akron. Two of these are joined at a quadripoint.
 - Twinsburg Township has seven exclaves, of which four are enclaves in the city of Twinsburg. The city in turn has one piece connected by only a quadripoint, otherwise surrounded by the township.



- o In <u>Oregon</u>, the location of several businesses, including the world headquarters of <u>Nike</u>, <u>Inc.</u>, is surrounded by the city of <u>Beaverton</u>, but is within unincorporated Washington County.
- o In <u>Pennsylvania</u>, <u>Cumru Township</u> in <u>Berks County</u> has two exclaves, both separated by the city of <u>Reading</u>, and one of them is an enclave in Reading.
- o In Tennessee:
 - <u>Loudon County</u>, <u>Tennessee</u> has two exclaves, one of which is surrounded by <u>Monroe County</u>. There is a third parcel connected at a quadripoint, but otherwise surrounded by <u>Roane County</u>.
 - Dickson County has an exclave surrounded by Cheatham County.
 - <u>Davidson County</u> has an exclave surrounded by <u>Wilson County</u>.
- o In <u>Virginia</u>, <u>Fairfax County</u> has an exclave within the <u>City of Fairfax</u> that houses the county courthouse and some other county governmental offices. <u>Prince William County</u> has an exclave within the <u>City of Manassas</u> that houses the county courthouse and some other county governmental offices. <u>Montgomery County</u> has a small exclave consisting of two houses inside the independent city of <u>Radford</u>. Note that in Virginia, communities that are incorporated as *cities* are completely separate from counties; see <u>Political subdivisions of Virginia</u>.

UNITED STATES RESERVATIONS

In the United States of America:

- o In Arizona:
 - The <u>Hopi Reservation</u> is surrounded by the <u>Navajo</u> Reservation.
 - The city of <u>South Tucson</u> is an enclave in the city of <u>Tucson</u>.
- o In <u>Arkansas</u>, the City of <u>Cammack Village</u> is an enclave of <u>Little Rock</u>.
- o In California:
 - In 1956, <u>Newark</u> withdrew from the incorporation of the communities of Washington Township as the city of <u>Fremont</u> and is now surrounded by Fremont.
 - <u>Piedmont</u> incorporated in 1907 to avoid annexation by <u>Oakland</u> and is now surrounded by Oakland.
 - San Pablo, along with two small unincorporated areas, is completely surrounded by <u>Richmond</u>
 - The city of <u>San Fernando</u> is an enclave in the city of <u>Los</u> <u>Angeles</u>. <u>Beverly Hills</u> and <u>West Hollywood</u> together form another. <u>Culver City</u> and the unincorporated community of <u>Ladera</u> <u>Heights</u> form a third enclave.



- The city of <u>Signal Hill</u> is entirely surrounded by the city of <u>Long</u> Beach.
- The city of <u>Villa Park</u> is an enclave of the city of <u>Orange</u>.
- The unincorporated area of <u>Broadmoor</u> is surrounded by <u>Daly City</u>.
- The unincorporated area of <u>Fig Garden</u> is surrounded by <u>Fresno</u>.
- Many other California cities have small enclaves of unincorporated area.
- In <u>Florida</u>, the town of <u>Baldwin</u> is an enclave within the city of <u>Jacksonville</u>. The Village of <u>Lazy Lake</u> is contained entirely within the borders of the city of <u>Wilton Manors</u>.
- o In <u>Georgia</u>, <u>Remerton</u> is an enclave of <u>Valdosta</u>; similarly, <u>Payne City</u> was an enclave within the city of <u>Macon</u> until it was dissolved in 2015. [68]
- o In <u>Idaho</u>, <u>Garden City</u> is an enclave in the city of <u>Boise</u>.
- In <u>Illinois</u>, <u>Norridge</u> and <u>Harwood Heights</u> together form an enclave in the city of <u>Chicago</u>.
- o In <u>Indiana</u>, after the passage of <u>Unigov</u> in 1970 by the state legislature that merged the government of <u>Indianapolis</u> and <u>Marion County</u>, four cities remained independent and did not merge with Indianapolis three of those cities <u>Beech Grove</u>, <u>Southport</u>, and <u>Speedway</u> became enclaves of Indianapolis.
- o In Iowa, the city of University Heights is entirely surrounded by Iowa City.
- o In Kansas, the city of Eastborough is entirely surrounded by Wichita.
- o In <u>Kentucky</u>, when the governments of <u>Louisville</u> and <u>Jefferson County</u> merged in 2003, a bewildering array of enclaves was created, as all other incorporated cities in Jefferson County retained their status as separate cities. [69] Note that the entire <u>Ohio River</u> between the northern and southern low-water marks is now part of Louisville Metro.
 - Three other cities were, and still are, enclaved in cities other than Louisville:
 - Norbourne Estates and <u>Richlawn</u> are enclaves of <u>St.</u>
 Matthews.
 - Woodland Hills is an enclave of Middletown.
 - The merger created many other enclaves within the portion of Louisville Metro that includes pre-merger Louisville but excludes all other pre-existing cities, an entity defined by the <u>United States</u> <u>Census Bureau</u> as the <u>"Louisville-Jefferson County balance"</u>. As municipalities, these enclaves are not parts of the "balance," but rather, they are surrounded by the "balance."



- These individual enclaves: <u>Creekside</u>, <u>Fincastle</u>, <u>Glenview Hills</u>, <u>Hickory Hill</u>, <u>Hills and Dales</u>, <u>Hollow</u>
 <u>Creek</u>, <u>Hollyvilla</u>, <u>Lynnview</u>, <u>Minor Lane</u>
 <u>Heights</u>, <u>Shively</u>, <u>South Park View</u>, <u>Spring Mill</u>, and <u>Thornhill</u>.
- The combination of <u>Cambridge</u>, <u>Houston</u> <u>Acres</u>, <u>Lincolnshire</u>, and <u>St. Regis Park</u>.
- The combination of <u>Poplar Hills</u>, <u>Watterson Park</u>, and <u>West Buechel</u>.
- The aforementioned cities of Middletown, Norbourne Estates, Richlawn, St. Matthews, and Woodland Hills, along with 46 other municipalities are part of a large composite enclave within the "balance."

o In Michigan:

- The city of <u>Center Line</u> is completely surrounded by <u>Warren</u>.
- <u>Highland Park</u> and <u>Hamtramck</u> border each other, but the two together are completely surrounded by <u>Detroit</u>.
- The city of <u>Lathrup Village</u> is completely surrounded by <u>Southfield</u>.
- The city of Springfield is completely surrounded by Battle Creek.

o In Minnesota:

- The city of <u>Centerville</u> is completely surrounded by <u>Lino Lakes</u>.
- The city of <u>Hilltop</u> is completely surrounded by <u>Columbia Heights</u>.
- The city of <u>Landfall</u> is completely surrounded by <u>Oakdale</u>.
- The city of Long Lake is completely surrounded by Orono.
- The city of <u>Loretto</u> is completely surrounded by <u>Medina</u>.
- The city of Medicine Lake is completely surrounded by Plymouth.
- The city of Peterson is completely surrounded by Rushford Village.
- The city of Rushford is completely surrounded by Rushford Village.
- The city of St. Bonifacius is completely surrounded by Minnetrista.
- The city of Willernie is completely surrounded by Mahtomedi.
- o In <u>Missouri</u>, the cities of <u>Gladstone</u> and <u>North Kansas City</u> are separately surrounded by <u>Kansas City</u>.
- In <u>Montana</u>, when the governments of <u>Butte</u> and <u>Silver Bow County</u> merged in 1977, the town of <u>Walkerville</u> voted not to join the consolidated government, thus becoming an enclave.
- o In New Jersey:

- In <u>New York</u>, the city of <u>Cortland</u>, <u>New York</u>, <u>seat</u> of <u>Cortland County</u>, is entirely surrounded by the <u>town</u> of <u>Cortlandville</u>, from which it is legally separate. Likewise, the city of <u>Beacon</u> is surrounded by the <u>Town of Fishkill</u>.
- In North Dakota, the city of Prairie Rose is an enclave of Fargo.
- In Ohio:
 - o The cities of <u>Brice</u>, <u>Bexley</u>, and <u>Whitehall</u> are all enclaves of <u>Columbus</u>.
 - The city of <u>Norwood</u> is an enclave of <u>Cincinnati</u>. The cities of <u>Elmwood</u> <u>Place</u>, to the north, and <u>St. Bernard</u>, to the south, together form another enclave of Cincinnati.
 - In <u>Stark County</u>, the village of <u>Hills & Dales</u> is enclaved within <u>Jackson Township</u>.
 - o In <u>Summit County</u>, the village of <u>Lakemore</u> is surrounded by <u>Springfield</u> Township.
- In Oregon, the city of Maywood Park is surrounded by Portland.
- In Pennsylvania, every county in the state other than the counties of Fulton, Philadelphia, Pike and Union contains at least one municipality in another municipality. There are at least 338 enclaves in the state comprising incorporated <u>places</u> and <u>census-designated places</u> within other county subdivisions. Usually, the enclave takes the form of a borough that is surrounded by the township of which it was originally a part, but other scenarios are possible (e.g., the Borough of Mount Oliver is an enclave of Pittsburgh; Pitcairn borough, of Monroeville; Dale borough, of Johnstown; and the Lackawanna County township of Elmhurst, of Roaring Brook Township). While Pennsylvania's urban counties contain few enclaves due to municipal fragmentation, rural areas feature numerous enclaved municipalities. Many resulted from small town centers separating from their rural surrounding areas.
- In <u>Tennessee</u>:



- o The cities of <u>Red Bank</u> and <u>Ridgeside</u> are enclaves in the city of <u>Chattanooga</u>.
- o The city of Berry Hill is an enclave of the city of Nashville.
- o The cities of <u>Belle Meade</u>, <u>Forest Hills</u> and <u>Oak Hill</u> together form an enclave of the city of Nashville.
- Ooltewah is an enclave of <u>Collegedale</u>.

• In Texas:

- o The cities of <u>Alamo Heights</u>, <u>Balcones Heights</u>, <u>Castle Hills</u>, <u>Hill Country Village</u>, <u>Hollywood Park</u>, <u>Kirby</u>, <u>Leon Valley</u>, <u>Olmos Park</u>, <u>Shavano Park</u>, and <u>Terrell Hills</u> are all enclaves of <u>San Antonio</u>. [72]
- The cities of <u>Bellaire</u>, <u>West University Place</u>, and <u>Southside Place</u> together form an enclave of <u>Houston</u>. The cities of <u>Bunker Hill Village</u>, <u>Hedwig Village</u>, <u>Hilshire Village</u>, <u>Hunters Creek Village</u>, <u>Piney Point Village</u>, and <u>Spring Valley Village</u> together form another enclave of Houston.
- The cities of <u>Highland Park</u> and <u>University Park</u>, collectively known locally as the <u>"Park Cities"</u>, together form an enclave of <u>Dallas</u>. In addition, the city of <u>Cockrell Hill</u> is also an enclave of Dallas.
- o The city of <u>Sunset Valley</u> is enclave of <u>Austin</u>. [73]
- Oaks, Saginaw, Sansom Park, Westover Hills, Westworth Village, and White Settlement are enclaves of Fort Worth
- The cities of <u>Dalworthington Gardens</u> and <u>Pantego</u> together form an enclave of <u>Arlington</u>.
- The city of Beverly Hills is an enclave of Waco.

• In Vermont:

- The city of Rutland is an enclave of the town of Rutland.
- o The city of St. Albans is an enclave of the town of St. Albans.
- In <u>Virginia</u>, under Virginia law, all municipalities that are incorporated as *cities* are legally <u>independent</u> of any <u>county</u>. Fifteen such enclaves thirteen individual cities, plus two pairs of adjoining cities exist within the state; some of the cities that form these enclaves serve as <u>county seat</u> of the surrounding county:
 - o <u>Bedford</u>, enclaved within and the county seat of <u>Bedford County</u>
 - o Buena Vista, enclaved within Rockbridge County
 - o Charlottesville, enclaved within and the county seat of Albemarle County
 - o Covington, enclaved within and the county seat of Alleghany County
 - o Emporia, enclaved within and the county seat of Greensville County



- Fairfax, enclaved within and the county seat of Fairfax County. As noted above, the county courthouse is located in an unincorporated portion of Fairfax County that is completely surrounded by the city.
- Harrisonburg, enclaved within and the county seat of <u>Rockingham</u>
 County
- o Lexington, enclaved within and the county seat of Rockbridge County
- Manassas and Manassas Park together form an enclave within Prince William County. Manassas is the county seat; as noted above, the county courthouse is located in an unincorporated portion of Prince William County that is completely surrounded by the city.
- o Martinsville, enclaved within and the county seat of Henry County
- o Norton, enclaved within Wise County
- Roanoke and Salem together form an enclave within Roanoke County. The Roanoke County Courthouse is located in Salem, but the rest of the county government is located in the unincorporated community of Cave Spring.
- o Staunton, enclaved within and the county seat of Augusta County
- o Waynesboro, enclaved within Augusta County
- o Winchester, enclaved within and the county seat of Frederick County
- In <u>Wisconsin</u>, the village of <u>Thiensville</u> is an enclave of the city of <u>Mequon</u> in <u>Ozaukee County</u>.

In the United States of America:

- In <u>Alaska</u>, the <u>Unorganized Borough</u> is separated into multiple sections; however, the only true exclave that is not an enclave is the town of <u>Hyder</u>, which belongs to <u>Prince of Wales – Hyder Census Area</u>.
- o In Georgia, Brooks County has a small portion separated by Lowndes County and Madison County, Florida.
- In <u>Louisiana</u>, a portion of <u>St. Martin Parish</u> is separated by <u>Iberia Parish</u>.
 A portion of <u>West Feliciana Parish</u> is separated by <u>Concordia Parish</u>.
 A portion of <u>Madison Parish</u> is separated by <u>Warren County</u>, <u>Mississippi</u>.
- In <u>Massachusetts</u>, <u>Norfolk</u> <u>County</u> has two exclaves: <u>Brookline</u> between <u>Middlesex</u> and <u>Suffolk</u> counties, and <u>Cohasset</u> on the coast of <u>Plymouth County</u>.
- o In Michigan:
 - In <u>Houghton County</u>: The city of <u>Houghton</u> divides <u>Portage</u> and <u>Adams</u> townships into



- two sections apiece, and the city of <u>Hancock</u> divides <u>Quincy</u> <u>Township</u> in two as well.
- Brownstown Township, Wayne County is separated into three parts. The two smaller parts are separated from the main portion of the township by Woodhaven. Both smaller parts are further separated by Rockwood and Gibraltar.

o In New Jersey:

- In <u>Atlantic County</u>, <u>Egg Harbor Township</u> is split into three parts.
- In <u>Bergen County</u>, the township of <u>South Hackensack</u> is divided into three separate parts as a result of other municipalities withdrawing from it.
- In <u>Burlington County</u>, the borough of <u>Wrightstown</u> has two sections.
- In <u>Camden County</u>, <u>Haddon Township</u> is split into three parts, of which two are joined at a <u>quadripoint</u>.
- In <u>Monmouth County</u>, <u>Aberdeen Township</u> is divided into two pieces.
- In <u>Morris County</u>, the township of <u>Randolph</u> has a tiny exclave, and <u>Rockaway Township</u> has a small portion that is joined by only a quadripoint.
- o In New Mexico, Sandoval County has an exclave. During World War II, Los Alamos County was created out of parts of Sandoval and Santa Fe Counties, for the convenience of the Manhattan Project. That portion of Sandoval County that is within the San Ildefonso Indian Reservation, about 3 km², became an exclave bounded by Los Alamos County on the southwest, Santa Fe County on the east and Rio Arriba County on the north.
- o In New York: In Westchester County, Rye Town has an exclave separated by Harrison and Rye City.
- o In Pennsylvania:
 - In <u>Allegheny County</u>, <u>O'Hara Township</u> consists of <u>five</u> non-contiguous areas, with <u>Sharpsburg</u>, <u>Aspinwall</u> and <u>Fox Chapel</u> separating them. One area (<u>Sixmile Island</u>) is enclaved within Sharpsburg.
 - In <u>Berks County</u>, in addition to the two exclaves of <u>Cumru Township</u> mentioned above, <u>Lower Alsace Township</u> has an exclave separated from the rest of the township by the borough of <u>Mount Penn</u>.



- In <u>Chester County</u>, <u>Schuylkill Township</u> has a small exclave separated by <u>Phoenixville</u>. In addition, <u>Valley Township</u> has an exclave created by a narrow strip of land that is part of Coatesville.
- Three municipalities in <u>Delaware County</u> have exclaves. <u>Springfield Township</u> has an exclave separated from the main body of the township by the village of <u>Swarthmore</u>; <u>Darby Township</u> consists of two noncontiguous areas; and part of <u>Upper Darby</u> is separated from the main body of the township by <u>Aldan</u> and <u>Lansdowne</u>.
- In <u>Lackawanna County</u>, <u>South Abington Township</u> has an exclave along Glenburn Road bordered by <u>Clarks Summit</u> borough and <u>Waverly Township</u>. The township itself is oddly shaped and borders the collective area of Clarks Summit, <u>Clarks Green</u>, and Waverly Township on three sides.
- There are four sets of exclaves in <u>Schuylkill County</u>. <u>Norwegian Township</u> has a small exclave separated by the city of <u>Pottsville</u>, and <u>West Mahanoy Township</u> is split into two sections, separated by the borough of <u>Gilberton</u>. In addition, the borough of <u>Auburn</u> creates exclaves of both <u>South Manheim Township</u> and <u>West Brunswick Township</u>.
- In <u>York County</u>, <u>Spring Garden Township</u> has an exclave separated from the rest of the township by the city of <u>York</u>.
- o In <u>South Carolina</u>, <u>Pickens County</u> has two exclaves separated by <u>Oconee County</u> and <u>Anderson County</u>.
- o In Tennessee:
 - White County has a small portion separated by <u>Cumberland</u> <u>County</u> and <u>Van Buren County</u>.
 - <u>Tipton County</u> has a small portion separated by <u>Shelby County</u> and <u>Mississippi County</u>, <u>Arkansas</u>.
- The lands within numerous <u>Indian reservations</u> have been fragmented, with privately owned real estate intermixed with tribal, city, county, state, and federal authorities in a bewildering array of jurisdictional geographies.
 - Red Lake Indian Reservation has one large exclave bordering Canada (itself containing enclaves of nonreservation land) and numerous other small exclaves.



• Rosebud Indian Reservation also has numerous small exclaves.

<u>United States of America</u>: <u>Alaska</u> is bounded by <u>Canada</u>, the <u>Arctic Ocean</u>, the <u>Bering Sea</u> and the <u>Pacific Ocean</u>. Alaska is the world's largest semi-enclave.
